ZOË KEATING PERFORMS IN RENO TO BENEFIT RENO PHIL KIDS PROGRAMS

The Nightingale Family Foundation Hosts Benefit Concert Nov. 12, 2016

RENO, Nev. (Sept. 23, 2016)— The Nightingale Family Foundation brings acclaimed cellist and composer **Zoë Keating** to perform in Reno as a benefit concert for the Reno Phil's kids' programs (RPAK), hosted by the Nevada Museum of Art. Proceeds from the concert, set for **Nov. 12 at 8:00 p.m.** in the museum's Skyroom, will go to the Reno Phil's education and youth outreach initiatives.

"This is an extremely generous offering by Steven Nightingale and his foundation," Tim Young, CEO of the Reno Phil, said. "We're facing incredible demand for our RPAK programs and we've come to a point where we can't include all of the children who want to participate. Funds from this benefit will help us reach more kids in the community."

Zoë Keating is known for her use of technology in performances, using a cello and foot-controlled laptop to create layers of music through her performance. Keating boasts a global audience and has several times reached the number one spot on iTunes classical charts with her self-released albums.
